

I-3005: Ampicillin-KLH Conjugate

Storage:	Keep below -20°C for up to 1 year. Avoid repeated freeze-and-thaw. For short term storage (< 3 weeks) keep at 4°C.
Applications:	Used as immunogen for the generation of anti-ampicillin antibodies.

Brief description:

The ampicillin sodium and KLH (keyhole limpet hemocyanin) (10 mg each) are conjugated by EDC method in 0.1 M MES pH 5.0. The carboxyl group in the ampicillin is directly linked to an amine group in the KLH, and/or a carboxyl group in the KLH is directly linked to the amine group in the ampicillin, without any linker by EDC conjugation method. Given the molecular weights of ampicillin sodium and KLH are 371.39 Da and 8,000 – 9,000 kDa, respectively, the molar ratio of ampicillin:KLH in the conjugation solution is 21541 - 24233:1. The resultant conjugation solution is then buffer-exchanged with 20 mM PBS, pH 7.4. The number of ampicillin that is actually conjugated to each KLH molecule is not determined.

The ampicillin-KLH conjugate has been successfully used as an immunogen in inducing ampicillin specific antibodies in mice.

Due to its high molecular weight and its tendency to form aggregates, the conjugate is not completely soluble in the buffer that it is in. Therefore, it is strongly recommended to vigorously vortex immediately prior to aliquot or use.
